Clerk's Report and Assets Report from 11.07.2021 to 13.08.2021

This report is to provide an update on actions taken and not covered elsewhere on the Agenda within the time period above:

- GM Services have refitted the net connector and will complete the repairs on the slide. The nut covers are in place and Chris has been tasked to sort the gate and fence around the Play Park. This will complete the tasks identified in the RoSPA report.
- The Pavilion has been made secure with new locks on the double doors, rear door and an additional dead lock on the rear door all configured to the same key. The broken window has been boarded up and the glass removed. Work to repair this will be included in the refurbishment of the Pavilion specification.
- The new Allotment tap will be fitted towards the end of the season (October or November) and a letter to that effect has been put on the Allotment noticeboard.
- Ed Wilkinson has been asked to complete the additional work agreed in Church Yard One – strimming overgrown areas around graves, pruning trees, weeding and making sure the paths are clear and grass encroachment cut back. He will also weed the path and flower beds in the Memorial Green.
- The MBC planning forum outlined the Planning team and process which is being updated and improved. Key to this is communication with Parish Councils and there is an offer for Parish Council training. We are waiting to see what this entails.
- A list of street furniture (benches, dog dispensers and dog bins, planters, grit bins) will be drawn up in the next month and submitted to LCC for the appropriate licences.
- The Parish Office will re-open for an hour a week from the beginning of September and the times will be published on the website.
- Following a request from a resident on Melton Road, LCC have been contacted to ask why a post and rail fence was erected between 43 and 45 in front of the cover from view fence already erected by Brampton Valley. Chamonix Estates (CE Northern Counties), the grounds contractors for Brampton Valley, have also been contacted to ask how they propose to maintain the area between 43 and 45.
- CE Northern Counties have also agreed to allow a new defibrillator to be located on the Brampton Valley Estate.
This is the quote from Community Heartbeat for a suitable device:
– no power required – post mounted – compliant to all new legislation.
Zoll AED 3 defibrillator in a thermal bag, visualised CPR coaching, spare adult/child electrodes, Rescue Wrist ShockBox Sentry Insulated Cabinet Community signage Delivery
£2130 (ex VAT) (no electrician required to install)
A quote will need to be obtained for erecting a suitable mount (two wooden posts and a board) – could we approach Brampton Valley?
The alternative (which would need an electricity supply) is around £1520 with an additional cost of approximately £200 to install and would need a wall to be mounted on.
