

**NOTICE OF MAKING A PUBLIC PATH ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 119,
FOOTPATHS E99 & F1 -WALTHAM ON THE WOLDS
MELTON BOROUGH COUNCIL WALTHAM ON THE WOLDS
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER NO 3 2020**

The above Order was made on 27 January 2021 under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980. The effect of the Order will be to divert part of the footpaths E99 & F1 at Waltham on the Wolds within the Borough of Melton. The sections of footpath at to be diverted are shown as a bold continuous lines on the attached order map (Plan Number 16009/FD/E99 F1)

An alternative footpath F1 instead to be created shown as a bold broken line on the attached order Map (Plan number 16009/FD/E99 F1) running from point N at Grid Reference 48011 32453 in a generally northerly direction for a distance of approximately 20 metres to point L previously described. Also a footpath shown as a bold broken line running from point K previously described, in a generally northerly direction to join the new route of Footpath E99 at point H at Grid Reference 48014 32464.

Also an alternative Footpath E99 instead to be created shown as a bold broken line on the attached order Map (Plan number 16009/FD/E99 F1) running from point A, previously described in generally east-north-east then northerly directions through points F, G, B, H, I, J and D for a total distance of approximately 125 metres to join the existing route of Footpath E99 at point E previously described.

A copy of the order and the order map have been deposited at Parkside, Station Approach, Burton Street, Melton Mowbray, Leics. They may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9am-5pm Monday-Friday. Copies of the map and order may be purchased at the price of £15 by sending a cheque to Melton Borough Council.

Any representation or objection with respect to the order may be sent or delivered in writing to the Solicitor to the Council, Melton Borough Council, Parkside, Station Approach, Burton Street, Melton Mowbray, Leics, LE13 1GH not later than 24th June 2021 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, Melton Borough Council may itself confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representation or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.
